Terms of Enrollment

- A minimum non-refundable deposit of \$115 as well as a \$35 application fee per camper must accompany this application as a deposit. Applications submitted on or after April 27 must include payment in full.
- If the camper is withdrawn on or before April 27, \$150 will be retained as a non-refundable administrative fee. For campers withdrawn April 28 through June 8, 50 percent of tuition fees paid are refundable. Starting June 9, NO tuition will be refunded. If tuition has not been paid for registered weeks, I will be billed for the tuition. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS!
- I understand that my credit card on file will be billed the full amount of any remaining account balance if not paid in full by February 24 or April 27 (depending on my registration preference).
- All fees will be refunded or returned if camper is placed on a waiting list and not accepted into the program. Sibling policy: Even if sibling is on a waiting list, I understand cancellation policies are still in effect for siblings who are enrolled.
- I understand that camp registration is non-transferable. I understand that Camp Sonshine has one week programs and under no circumstances may weeks be split between campers. I understand that Camp Sonshine is not responsible for applications lost in the mail.
- I understand that full or partial payments may be made at any time and that there will be a tuition savings for weeks paid in full by February 24. In any event, all fees must be paid in full by April 27. I understand that not meeting the set fee deadlines will result in a late fee being added to my account and/or my child being withdrawn from camp without refund. Please see pages 11-13 for financial information and fee amounts.
- I understand the 24 hour departure change policy in which Camp Sonshine reserves the right to charge a \$8 administrative fee for changes in mode of departure made without a 24 hour notice.
- I have completed all required information and I have enclosed my payment. I understand that representatives of Camp Sonshine, cannot, without exception, guarantee availability on the phone. All applications are processed in order of arrival, and I will be notified by mail or phone if I am on a waiting list. Upon acceptance, I will be sent a confirmation letter or email.
- I understand that by signing this Parental Consent form I assume responsibility for payment of camp tuition and fees.

First Aid and Safety Policies

- Since local health regulations prohibit the camp from administering non-prescription drugs without written parental approval, I authorize the camp to administer Children's Tylenol, Antacid (Tums), Children's Benadryl, cough drops, ear drops, and eye drops for appropriate symptoms as described on product label. I understand that certain topical over-the-counter medicines and products such as Cortizone, Bactine, Caladryl, Benzocaine, sunscreen, and bug spray are used for bee stings, poison ivy, bug bites, abrasions, skin irritations, and preventative measures. If any medicine listed above or any topical medicine is unacceptable, I will notify Camp Sonshine in writing in the "Health History and Medical Information" section of this application. I further give permission for Camp Sonshine to provide routine healthcare for minor scrapes, cuts, and other minor injuries or illnesses.
- Camp Sonshine cannot administer prescription drugs to my child, even with written parental consent, unless the medication is sent in a properly labeled container provided by a pharmacy and accompanied by a specific written authorization from the prescribing physician. I agree to have the medicine and forms turned in by the dates specified in the Parent Guide.
- In the event that I cannot be reached in an emergency, I hereby give permission to the physician or dentist selected by the camp to hospitalize, secure proper treatment for and order medical care including but not limited to injections, anesthesia, or surgery for my child (as deemed necessary by licensed staff). My child's physician or his/her office should be contacted, if possible. I also understand that I am financially responsible for the medical care of my child.
- I certify that I have given Camp Sonshine correct medical information for my child(ren) and will notify the organization if there are any changes.
- My child has permission, without restriction, to participate in all snacks, regular and special programming, including out of camp trips, transportation, and Latestays or Overnights (where applicable), unless I notify the camp otherwise in writing in the "Health History and Medical Information" section of this application. I understand and realize Camp Sonshine will follow safety procedures, but that all physical activities include a certain risk and that Camp Sonshine assumes no liability for injury or damage arising from or as a result of participation. I affirm that I have been advised that field sports, ropes courses, go-karts, camp craft, canoes, paddle boats, indoor and outdoor games, hiking, whitewater rafting, amusement parks, swimming, and other camp activities include certain risks and dangers. These risks include, but are not limited to loss of or damage to personal property, injury, or fatality. In consideration of, and as part payment for, the right to participate in all Camp Sonshine activities and the services and food arranged (when applicable) for my child by Camp Sonshine, and its agents, servants, and employees, I have assumed all of the above risks and intending to be legally bound hereby, will hold Camp Sonshine and its agents, servants, and employees harmless from any liability which may arise out of or in connection with any trips, food provided, and related participation in any other activities arranged for by Camp Sonshine, its agents, servants, and employees. The terms hereof shall serve as a RELEASE AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK for any minors.

CAMP SONSHINE DAY CAMP SUMMER CONDUCT AGREEMENT 2012

(FOR CAMPER'S 7TH GRADE AND ABOVE AND HIGH ADVENTURE)

Campers will agree to the following Internet Social Networking and Blogging Policies:

- Campers must be respectful in all communications, blogs and posting photograph/ videos when related to or referencing Camp Sonshine, its employees, and other campers.
- Campers must not use blogs or personal Web sites to slander, harass, bully, or intimidate other campers or employees of Camp Sonshine, which include, but are not limited to comments that are derogatory with respect to race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, color, or disability; sexually suggestive, humiliating, or demeaning comments; and threats to stalk, haze, or physically injure another person.
- Campers must not use blogs or personal Web sites to discuss engaging in conduct that is prohibited by camp policies, including, but not limited to, the use of alcohol and drugs, sexual behavior, sexual harassment, and bullying.
- For safety reasons, please do not post Camp Sonshine schedules or other campers/leaders personal information on the Internet.

Campers will:

- Respect the rights and authority of staff. This includes obeying all directives from camp staff. Remember that the counselors are responsible for you while you are away from home, and they will do what is needed to make camp safe and enjoyable for everyone.
- Stay in sight of your counselor. Understand that it is your responsibility to stay with your counselor, and for them to know where you are at all times.
- Not leave camp premises or designated location, area, or event without staff supervision and permission.
- Will dress appropriately for a co-ed outdoor recreation experience, including wearing modest swimwear and close toed shoes.
- Be willing to share information in matters relating to the health, safety, and welfare of the group. If you feel the need to tell the counselors something, you can do so at any time. Please don't ever be afraid to speak with an adult leader.
- Treat the employees of the places we visit with respect and use good manners.
- Respect the rights and privacy of all campers and staff. Gossip and talking behind people's backs are unnecessary, very unkind, and can be extremely hurtful. Respect the personal dignity, opinions, and possessions of others. Stealing will not be tolerated.
- Use all equipment and supplies properly and not intentionally damage camp equipment or facilities, including graffiti. Understand that your parents will be charged for any damages that you cause.
- Respect your camp bus and bus drivers and adhere to all bus rules. Stay in your seat at all times when the vehicle is in motion.
- Agree to follow all overnigher and hotel rules given by my counselors; including not to leave their assigned sleeping area (hotel room, tent, room) after lights out, and respecting others with regarding to keeping noise levels down.

Campers will not:

- Bring knives or weapons of any kind to camp or on overnight trips for any reason.
- Bring cell phones, MP3 players/iPods, two-way radios, DVD players, laptop computers, or electronic devices/ games to camp or overnight locations. Camp will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items.
- Use cuss words, inappropriate language or topics of conversation, including terms like "Shut up". Name-calling such as "loser", "stupid", "idiot" and "moron" are unacceptable here even if spoken in jest.
- Make physical contact with staff or other campers in any angry or threatening way.
- Campers must keep their hands to themselves at all times. Fighting will not be tolerated.
- Engage in or promote verbal or physical fighting, hazing or harassment of other campers or staff.
- Engage in any of the following inappropriate behaviors: sexual harassment, inappropriate touching, verbal sarcasm, any form of unwanted attention, kissing, sitting on laps and refrain from any sexual misconduct.
- Shoplift, use or possess tobacco, drugs, alcohol and/ or sexual material.

In general please be aware of and abide by all camp and program rules and procedures. If you are not sure of something, ask. Take responsibility for your actions; you alone decide if you will make good or bad choices.
